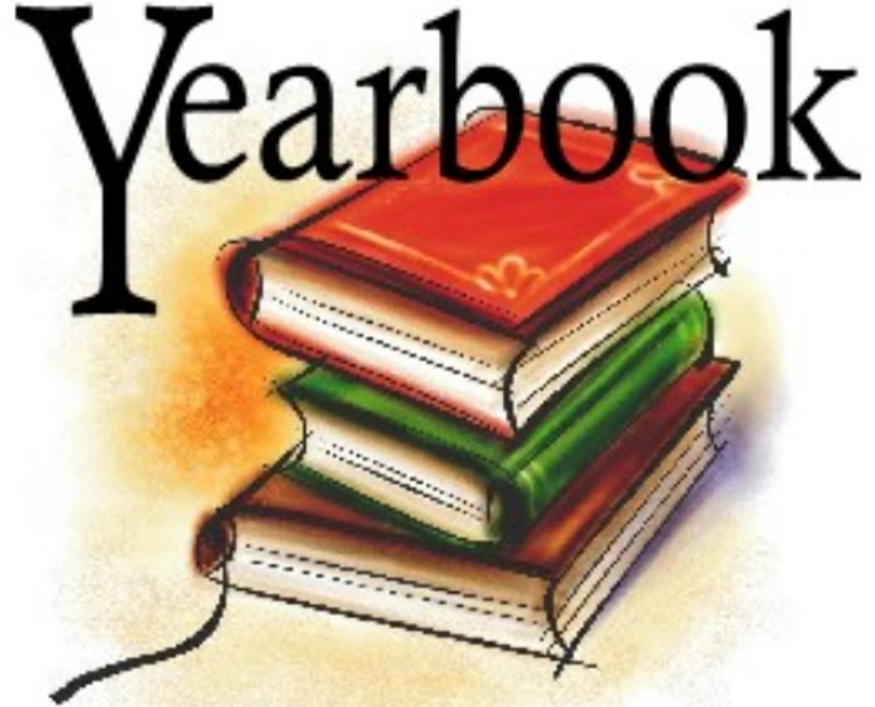

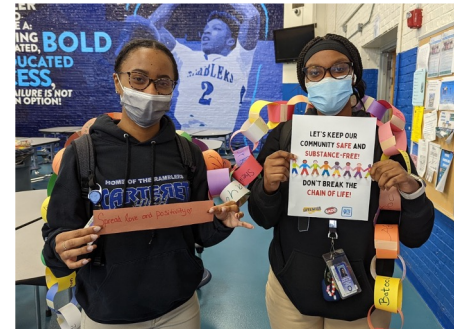

Letters for Rose (LFR)

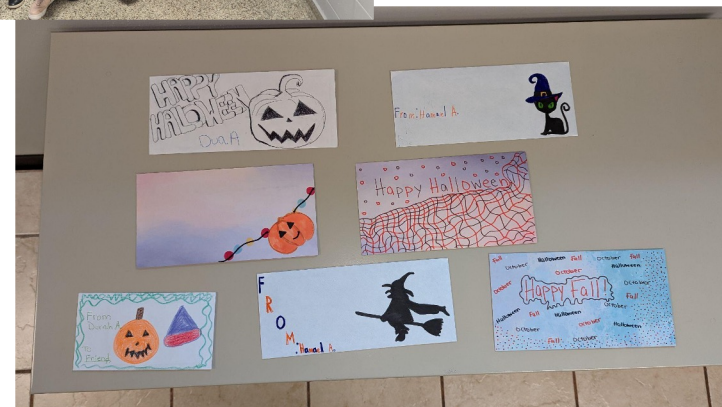

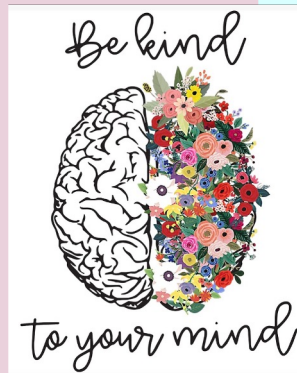

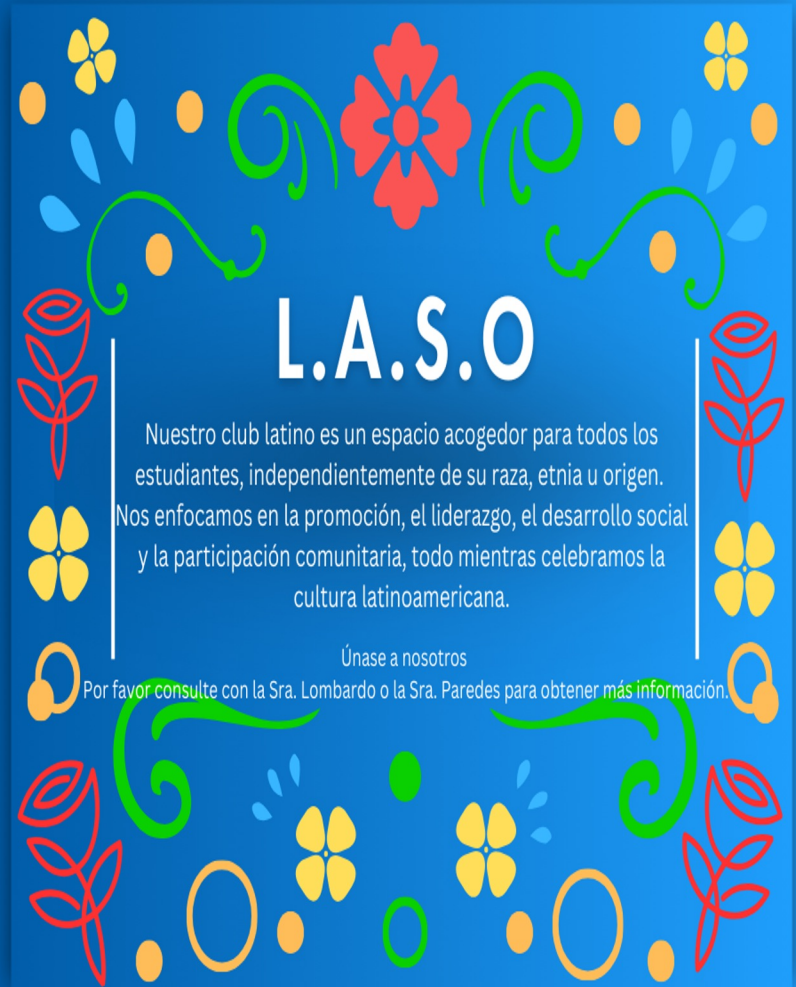
Latin American Student Organization

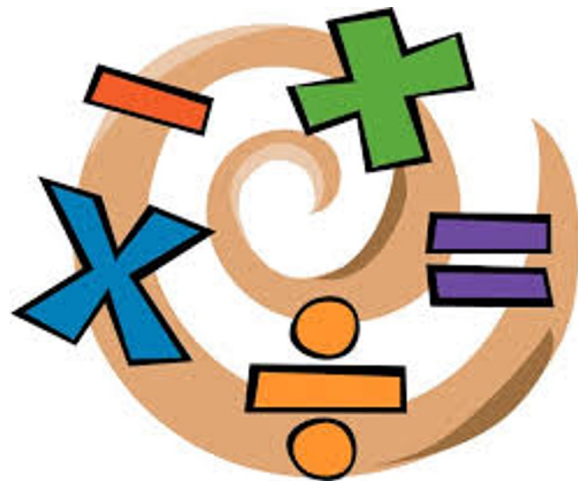
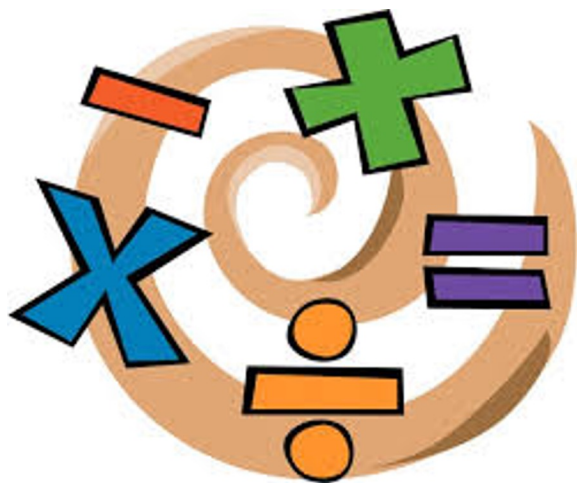
2024-2025 STUDENT COUNCIL

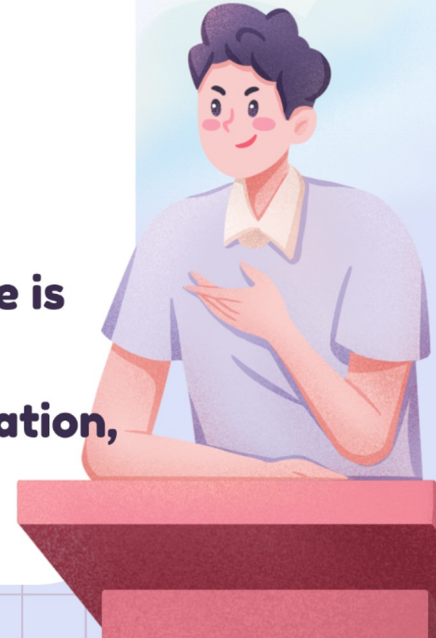
