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THINK TANK!


Welcome to the Columbus School T.H.I.N.K. Tank! Students are linking their classroom experiences with hands-on stem centers. Here learners are beginning to form connections of what they are learning while improving their critical thinking, communication, and collaborative skills in stem related centers. Creativity is also being enhanced in the design and engineering centers as learners build and design with legos and fashion mannequins. Students are making connections of series and parallel circuits while working together in the snap circuit center. Stay tuned, as our fifth graders will be starting to work on coding with robots in the next few weeks!





An Ozobot is a miniature robot, the smallest of its kind. They have 5 openings on the bottom where light shines out. In each of these openings there is an optical sensor that detects the brightness of the paper underneath the Ozobot. This helps the Ozobot figure out where the white is on the paper as opposed to the black lines on the paper. The middle sensor is a color one that can detect red, green and blue. It is through these color combinations that Ozobot gets its coded commands.

Grade 5 students are learning the basics of coding using Ozobots. After calibrating the robot, students are giving it commands through a series of color codes. They are learning that certain colors put together create different coded commands for Ozobot to carry out.







BIZTOWN PRODUCT CREATORS

Students in Ms. Kaur's class are participating in a lesson on the Free Enterprise System for our new Junior Achievement Biztown program. In this activity, students were broken into small groups. They had to decide on a product to make and create a catchy name for it. They then had 2 minutes to create a prototype. Students were then given specific resources to create as many of their products as they can in only 10 minutes. They learned what it meant to be a producer, how to delegate responsibilities and to create the product efficiently.



COMMUNITY COUNTS!

In Mrs. Ali's special education classroom, the students are learning about businesses and landmarks in the community. They have visited the post office, library, and also the RWJ Fitness center for a tour and a short class. They also created a "Carteret Business Directory" poster in which they sorted environmental logos into categories such as: retail, banking, convenience, fuel, automotive, dining, hotel, kids and family, and medical. Currently they are working on a "Categorizing Shoprite" unit in which they practice sorting and recognizing food items into aisles and departments. In December, they will visit Shoprite to purchase items on their grocery list using the skills they have practiced.







Spooktacular Halloween Fun!

Mrs. Bubbico and Ms. Chavers' class had a spooktacular Halloween this year. The students transformed into Spider-Man, a skeleton, Iron Man and so much more! Throughout the day, the students participated in Hallow-een/fall activities. The students created their own skeleton out of straws, danced to the Monster Mash and marched in the school parade.

On October 12th, the fifth graders took a trip to Carteret City Hall for the raising of the Spanish flag to commemorate Hispanic Heritage month. The students created flags of the Spanish speaking countries, read poems and performed Fiesta en America to conclude the event. Mayor Reiman greeted the students and provided them with snacks. 


VETERAN'S DAY ARTWORK




